HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE: Other Known navigation improvements in the Tennessee River watershed are wing dams constructed in the 1880's by the Corps along 40 mi. of the FRENCH BROAD RIVER in North Carolina, between Brevard and Asheville. These might still be visible and used by canoeists, who should keep an eye out for other historic streambed sites.
